Details of Proposed Amendment: to rezone the subject land from 'General Agricultural Zone (A2)' to 'Special General Agricultural Zone (A2-sp)' to permit an excavation business on the subject lands which also contain a hog operation.

Mr. Henri Van Warby, owner and Mr. Wesley Donkers, agent, were in attendance representing the application.

Ms. St. Clair outlined the application as contained within Report CP 2023-151. She advised that the applicant is requesting permission to permit an excavation business on the property and

facilitate construction of a new contractors shop for the servicing of agricultural and excavation equipment. The shop addition would replace a portion of an existing storage building. She provided information with respect to the existing farm/hog operation, on-farm diversified uses and agricultural related uses. Ms. St. Clair further clarified that contractors and excavating yards are not considered allowable within these categories and not directly related to agricultural operations. She explained that while the existing excavating business may serve some agricultural business in the area, it has not been demonstrated that it needs to be located there and these uses are better suited to industrially zoned areas having access to municipal services.

Mr. Wesley Donkers, agent, advised he had no comments.

In response to Council questions, Mr Henry Van Warby, owner, advised that 80% of the excavating business is local agriculture and they wish to build on because they have ran out of room.

There was no one in attendance that wished to speak in favour of or against the application.

Details of Proposed Amendment: to rezone the subject lands from 'Institutional Zone (I)' to 'Special Institutional Zone – Temporary (I-spT)' to permit a temporary structure for the purpose of assembly occupancy with a number of site-specific provisions.

The effect of the proposed amendment would be to permit a temporary structure (a tent) on the subject lands, which contain an existing place of worship.

Site specific relief from the development provisions of the Township Zoning Bylaw are also required, as follows;

- a reduction to the rear yard depth from 10 m (3.28 ft) to 2.2 m (7.5 ft);
- a reduction to the exterior side yard width from 10 m (32.8 ft) to 2.9 m (9.58 ft);
- a reduction to the required number of parking spaces from 45 spaces to 1.

This application was withdrawn by the applicant on May 19, 2023.

Pamela Antonio and Frank Gross

Re: Transitioning the Blue Box Program to Extended to Producer Responsibility

Mr. Gross provided an overview of the Provincial program to move the collection and reclcling of blue box materials to producers and the process to transform the current waster diversion operation to meet the Provincial direction to eliminate waste, improve recycling and make producers responsible for the end of life management of their products and packaging materials.

Ms. Antonio advised that some areas that currently receive collection will no longer be eligible within the new framework introduced. This will include areas such as: BIA districts, churches and some split use properties. There are discussions taking place regarding possible solutions to this issue. She explained that advertising will take place to increase public awareness.

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There was Council discussion with respect to: the producers passing that cost back to the consumers, options for providing pick-up to those not eligible and the recovery rate of recycled materials.

Ms. McDonald spoke to recent events in Petawawa and encouraged Council to declare pride month and acknowledge many others, including; indigenous, black, brown, every child matters and veterans. She challenged Council to make a safe and inclusive area.

In following the news coverage, it is apparent the community is more divided, people are leaving Norwich because of this issue and businesses are choosing not to locate here. She provided a list of many groups, other municipalities and politicians that are speaking out against the decision.

Ms. Wild explained the meaning of each colour in the Progress Flag. She made reference to some Council member comments with respect to this by-law being what the people want. She provided statistics with respect to voters turnout and percentage of votes for each candidate

questioning the perception that the majority agree with the decision. Ms. Wild further questioned the reasoning of neutrality and future celebrations for Christmas and other religious holidays and customs.
